Huntsville, Mo. - Harold Edward Means, 72, of Huntsville, Mo., and formerly of Hoopeston, died at 4:31 p.m. Thursday, June 12, 2003, at Moberly Regional Medical Center in Moberly, Mo.

He was born Nov. 23, 1930, in Hoopeston, a son of Earl Ray and Katherine McElhaney Means. He married Rosemary Martin in 1959 at Hoopeston. She survives.

Also surviving is a son, Edward Means of Kansas City, Mo.; a brother, Joseph Means of Hoopeston; and a sister, Jean Marie Glass of Mesa, Ariz. He was preceded in death by his parents, a son, a brother, and two sisters.

Mr. Means attended Danville Junior College and Eastern Illinois University, where he received his bachelor', master's and advanced degree in education. He served as a classroom teacher, principal, Superintendent and County Superintendent of Coles County. He taught at Windsor, East Lynn, Kansas, Chrisman, Ludlow, and Bethany Schools. After retiring from Illinois, he went to Missouri, where he had served as Superintendent of Schools in many school districts. Mr. Means served in the education field for more than 40 years.

Mr. Means loved most sports, loved his students and love to tell stories. He was a great story teller.

Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Monday, June 16, 2003, at the Brown-Alkire Funeral Home, with Rev. Jeremy Morton officiating. Burial was in Floral Hill Cemetery, Hoopeston. Visitation was from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday at the funeral home.
